Per Department of Safety:

In order for the Department of Safety to take action a signed written complaint is needed with the drivers full name, date of birth or driver license number or social security number. Include a statement of why you feel this driver is medically, mentally or otherwise unsafe to operate a motor vehicle. Anyone can file a complaint. The Tennessee Code Annotated (TCA) 55-50-505 reads:

(b) The department (Department of Safety) may, upon receiving evidence sufficient to establish that a licensed driver is incompetent or otherwise not qualified to be licensed, upon written notice of at least twenty (20) days to the licensee, require the driver to submit to a driver license examination and/or submit any other information deemed appropriate by the commissioner. The department shall take action as may be appropriate and may suspend the license of the person or permit the driver to retain the license, or may issue a license subject to restrictions as permitted under § 55-50-331(d) and (e). Refusal or neglect of the licensee to submit to the examination shall be grounds for suspension of the driver license.

(c) All judges having jurisdiction over offenses committed under any statute of this state or municipal ordinance of any city or town regulating the operation of motor vehicles on highways shall have the authority to require any person brought before the court for an alleged violation to submit to a reexamination by the department when the judge has good cause to believe that the person would not be able to operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways, or at the discretion of the judge, would create a hazard to the driving public. However, the license of the person shall not be withheld or suspended pending the reexamination. Refusal or neglect of the licensee to submit to the examination shall be grounds for suspension or revocation of the license.
